BEST PRACTICE 1

1. Title of the Practice: STUDENTS' SUPPORT FUND

2. Objective of the Practice: The college introduced Students' Support Fund to provide financial assistance to deserving underprivileged students so as to alleviate some of their financial struggles.

3. The Context: Many of the students belong to underprivileged families who struggle with admission fees and examination fees, causing hindrances in their pursuance of a college degree. Such students are identified with the assistance of teachers from each department.

4. The Practice: Students' Support Fund assists students who are identified as unable to pay their fees due to financial constraints. The provision of financial aid ensures a better future for the selected students and assures them of the value and trust the college places on them. It is believed that an empathetic approach towards their hardships encourages and motivates them to overcome their adversities. In this academic year, twelve students were provided financial assistance during examination form fill up.

5. Evidence of Success: It has been noticed that the dropout rate has decreased since the introduction of Students' Support Fund. Students who have been assisted are observed to be participating enthusiastically in academic and extra-curricular activities.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required: One major issue that arises with the disbursement of Students' Support Fund is during the selection process as funds are inadequate to provide assistance to all the students who require them.

Receiving charity funds for students is a significant opportunity. The funds totalling Rs 12000/- were generously donated by Mrs Mercy Sellato, Miriam Bodony and Faith, Tours & Travels, Suzant. BEST PRACTICE 2

1. Title of the Practice: PRESERVATION OF THE NATURAL ECOLOGY OF THE COLLEGE CAMPUS

2. Objective of the Practice: The college recognizes the abundance of natural flora and fauna and attempts to preserve it so as to retain it in its natural form as best as possible and also instill the importance of environmental consciousness in the students and teachers.

3. The Context: The construction of buildings and pathways which are inevitable for the development of the infrastructure of the institution has unfortunately resulted in the destruction of some of the greenery that covers the campus. Attempts are being made to rectify this with proper planning and plantation of plants where convenient.

4. The Practice: The major initiatives under this practice have been taken up by the NSS Unit of the college. Different species of flora have been collected and planted by students and teachers. Awareness on the cruciality of the preservation of the natural ecology of the campus is being disseminated through such activities and also through discussions in classrooms. The college was also declared a plastic free campus in this academic year, i.e., 2022 - 2023, and measures have been taken to collect and discard all plastic waste in a way that has the least impact on the environment. Awareness Campaign on Fire Prevention has also been organized to make students aware of the harmful effects of fire and the ways in which fire breakouts can be prevented.





5. Evidence of Success: Both the student and teaching fraternity in the college have become more protective of the various species of plants and the animal life found within the campus, and are taking measures to maintain the natural ecology.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required: One major problem encountered in the process of this practice is that the college lacks the facilities required to nurture the varieties of plants that require special and proper care.
