## **THE COLLEGE**

Govt. Lawngtlai College was established on 18<sup>th</sup> August, 1980 to become the first Higher Educational Institution in Lai Autonomous District Council area and is one of the two colleges in the District, catering to the all-round development of the students of this remote area of the state. It was founded by a group of education-centred elders and was managed by the Lai Autonomous District Council rendering all possible helps even their building for conduct of classes. At present the college is located in a very tranquil area quite congenial to studies, sports and all other co0curricular activities. The College was upgraded to Deficit status in 1987 and subsequently provincialised in 2007 with 9 (nine) subjects in arts stream having four faculty members in each subjects and core facility in all the nine subjects. The College is affiliated to Mizoram University.

The college was assessed and accredited 'B' grade in 2008 by National Assessment and Accreditation Council and is awaiting accreditation for the second cycle. Unity among the leaders of this region, the public, the teachers and the student community will, in no doubt, bring a very bright future for the students to excel in all fields.

**ADMISSION:**

The college is situated in the most backward area of the southern corner of Mizoram which is sandwiched between Burma in the east and Bangladesh in the west. The region has the least literacy percentage and is now below the national level. As our objective is to bring such people to the level of the people of other areas of the state and the nation as well, students are admitted through interview by Admission Committee of the college. Since many students are from normal academic background, there is no chance of selecting the better ones; instead "First come First served" policy is practiced. Admission is open during the month of June every year.

**FEE STRUCTURE**

The rate of fee approved by the University and Govt. of Mizoram is collected from every student which has to be paid in full amount at the time of admission along with transportation (BUS) fee of Rs. 1000/- per annum.

**EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:**

**(a) Students Union:** Students Union (S.U) of the college with elected members function under the patronage of the Principal effectively organising and conducting many welfare activities for the students.

**(b) NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N.S.S.):** National Service Scheme (NSS) offers opportunities for the volunteers to take part in community services like Tree Plantation and Environment Protection under Green Mizoram project, Voluntary Blood Donation, Anti Drugs and Anti AIDS Campaign, Fire Prevention and Awareness, Anti Tobacco Campaign, Water and Environment Sanitation, Child Protection and also Women/Girls empowerment. Volunteers exhibit their talents during National Integration Camps and Youth Festival. NSS, Govt. Lawngtlai College was awarded the Best NSS UNIT Award 1998-1999 and the Best Programme Officer Award by the Government of India in 2000.

**(c) RED RIBBON CLUB:** The Red Ribbon Club of the college plays a vital role in organizing awareness campaigns against the hazards of HIV/AIDS among the students and the youth. Blood Donation Camps are organized twice a year.

**(d) EVANGELICAL UNION:** Evangelical Union conducts Devotion every Wednesday before classes start. Regular prayer meetings are also conducted

every Friday. The Union is equipped with musical instruments like Keyboard, Guitar and Drum, etc.

**(e) IGNOU STUDY CENTRE:** A study centre of the Indira Gandhi National Open University was started in 2005. It has produced many Graduates and not less than 100 Postgraduates so far. It plays a key role in providing educational opportunities to in –service personnel. It is upgraded to Regular Study Centre now.

**(f) LEGAL LITERACY CLUB:** Legal Literacy Club was established in 2018 in collaboration with District Legal Services Authority, Lawngtlai to make aware the students of their rights and duties.

**(g) ECO CLUB:** Eco Club was formed to empower students to participate and to take up meaningful environmental activities and to project, to educate students to create awareness amongst public.

## **CONDUCT OF EXAMINATION**

The End Semester Exams are conducted twice in a year by the University i.e. in May and November being Odd and Even Semesters respectively. Besides, Continuous Assessment Tests (Internal Assessment) are conducted in the college. A total of 100 marks is divided in to CA 25 and End Semester Exam 75.

The system of awarding marks in Continuous Assessment (CA) in theory courses is as follows:

The scheme of awarding marks in internal assessment for a practical course is given below:

Evaluation in the lab and record	12 Marks

For passing each course, a candidate must secure a minimum of 50 marks (equivalent to Grade 'B') in end semester examination. For internal assessment there shall be no passing marks. However, grading shall be based on marks obtained in both components i.e. internal assessment and end semester examination.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS:-**

- (1) Regular attendance is mandatory and it is one of the main criteria to sit in the End Semester Examination. A student should have a minimum attendance of 75% in aggregate in all the subjects.
- (2) Students are not entitled to any leave. In case of unavoidable circumstances, an application supported by relevant documents should be submitted to the principal.
- (3) Students representing the college, state and nation in sports, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities may be given appropriate attendance for the period of their engagement.
- (4) Students must be decent in their dress, personality, manners and behaviour inside the classroom and in the campus as well. Indecency will not be tolerated.
- (5) All students must wear College T-Shirt on every Monday and Thursday which is compulsory.
- (6) Smoking, chewing pan/ tobacco and use of intoxicating substances within the campus is prohibited.
- (7) Smoking, drinking and committing social evils while wearing College T-Shirt will lead to disciplinary action which may extend even up to expulsion from the college.
- (8) Abuse of any kind of drugs will invite instant action to the extent of dismissal from the college.
- (9) Male students are not allowed to have any long hair; they should have proper cut hair.
- (10) Partisan politics and the propagation of their policies inside the campus is strictly prohibited.
- (11) Discrimination among the students on grounds of caste, creed and religion is strictly prohibited.

- (12) As per Supreme Court orders, ragging in the college is strictly prohibited. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the college will take necessary action as per the UGC Regulation.
- (13) Proper and sympathetic assistance may be provided to PWD (Person With Disabilities) by all.
- (14) Internal Assessment Tests and Assignments is a part of the evaluation process and hence to be given due importance by all.
- (15) Mobile phones and other electronic devices must be switched off in the classroom and Examination Hall.

### **New Education Policy:**

In accordance with the NEP 2020, the UGC has formulated a new student-centric “curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes” incorporating a flexible choice-based credit system, multidisciplinary approach, and multi entry and exit options which will facilitate students to pursue their career path by choosing the subject/field of their interest.

Therefore, at this initial stage of implementation of NEP 2020, the UG programmes of Mizoram University will be of single Major with minor. Accordingly, the institution will offer a 3 –Year Bachelor’s Degree after successful completion of three years (6 Semesters with 120 credit)

In line with NEP 2020, the institution offers UG programs that encompass the following key aspects: -

- 1) A credit is a unit by which the coursework is measured. It determines the hours of instruction required per week over the duration of a semester (Minimum of 15 weeks).
- 2) Change of Major: Students can opt for a change in major within the broad discipline at the end of the first year.
- 3) Entry and Exit Options: As permissible under UGC Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institution (July, 2021), students will allowed to enter / re-enter in the odd semesters and exit after even semesters provided that they fulfill the minimum requirements for entry and exit.

- 4) Choice of Courses: Towards attainment of holistic and multidisciplinary education, list of courses to be offered by departments in a particular semester will be prepared and floated before the commencement of every semester. The students will then select the courses of their choice from the list being floated keeping in view of the requirements as per curriculum of the degree they are pursuing.
5. Attendance: A student shall be eligible to appear in the end-semester examination only if he/she has a minimum of 75% attendance.
6. Assessment: Assessment for different levels of qualification shall be done with strict adherence to the norms and guidelines of the affiliating University.
7. Repeating or Option for Other Courses:
  - (i) If a student fails in a particular course, he/she may repeat the same course in any semester.
  - (ii) Repetition of course(s) shall be only for end semester examinations.
  - (iii) In lieu of the failed courses, students may opt for the following in consultation with parent department- choose other course(s) having same credits-choose only courses approved by Mizoram University as per existing UGC regulations having same credits.
8. Reevaluation
  - (i) In case student is not satisfied with the marks obtained, he/she shall submit application for re-evaluation using prescribed form to the Controller of Examinations within 15 days from the date of declaration of results
  - (ii) The marks awarded in the re-evaluation shall be final.
9. Promotion: Student shall be allowed to proceed from the first semester up to the final semester with condition that they make up the requirements by repeating the same course(s) or choosing other relevant course(s) during relevant semesters.
10. Computation of Grades: Marks obtained by students will be converted into grades in the manner stipulated in UGC Guidelines.
11. Ranking: Programme / Subject wise ranking shall be done for the award of Gold Medal from students of 3 Year UG Programmes (for those exiting after completion of 3 Year UG Programmes) and 4 Year UG Programmes in the following manner:
  - i) Only those students who pass all the courses in regular chance with CGPA of 7.00 and above will be eligible for ranking.
  - ii) If two or more candidates secure same CGPA. the candidate having higher SGPA in 5th & 6th semesters (for students exiting after completion of 3 Year UG Programmes) and 7th & 8th semesters (for students of 4 Year UC Programmes) shall be considered
